N.E.C.:

Herewith I return pages 3, 4 and 5 of Office letter dated July 5th applying to Carlisle Training School, with the error which you detected corrected. I find Capt. Pratt is mistaken in all his notations where he says the positions are not new. The position of Clerk formerly paid \$1,000 per annum, but was reduced at the Captain's request to \$600. I am sustained in this view of the matter by the fact that there is no Clerk at \$1,000 reported by the Captain and on our books, neither are the Indian Assistants to the Laundress, the Assistants to the Baker or the Assistants to the Seamstress on our employe book.

I also enclose herewith page 12-13 of Genoa Training School. By some hook or crook all the positions from Superintendent of Printing to the end of the list were omitted. These modifications in Carlisle and Genoa will slightly affect the grand total.
