Sir:-

When we completed the Large and small boys' quarters in '87, on the grounds of economy and also thinking it might serve us as well, we left the walls with the second coat, brown sand finish and white coated only the ceilings.

The buildings have settled some and, the walls being dark in color the light in the buildings is inadequate on dark days.

I find that it serves much better to put the white coat on now than it would have done to have put it on at first as it enables

us to fill up the cracks and  
make the buildings sound and  
complete.

I would like to give a white  
coat to Small boys' Quarters now  
and after beginning of new fiscal  
year will ask authority for Large  
boys' quarters.
