To the Honorable,
The Com'r of Indian Affairs,
Washington, D. C.,

Sir:

Replying to your letter of the 17, marked Education, 8038 '90, in regard to the going home of Justin Shedee an Apache pupils from Arizona, now at this school, I have the honor to state that the said Justin Shedee is a boy of exceptionally good character, whose career here has been very satisfactory, but who is not quite as well up in literary as industrial qualifications.

Some time ago when an effort was made to ascertain the wishes of those who by expiration of period were entitled to go home he determined to stay at the school until after Examination and then go to the country. Now however he says he wants to change from that and go home at the end of the school term.

He had not made known his change of purpose in this matter, but as he entered ~~xxxxxx~~ the school in 1884 he is by expiration of term entitled to his choice.
