Whereas, on the 24<sup>th</sup> day of December, A. D. 1883. an agreement was entered into between Rev. James A. McCauley, and Hon. Robert M. Henderson, both of Carlisle, Penn., and Richard N. Poath, Captain ~~of the 1st~~ <sup>of the 1st</sup> Army, the executive Committee of the Board of Trustees holding title to the farm purchased from Benjamin W. Hooker, of the first part, and the Honorable A. Price, Commissioner of Indian Affairs, for and in behalf of the United States, party of the second part, <sup>ratifying a certain parole agreement made on or about July 6<sup>th</sup> 1883 and the continuance of the said agreement by a</sup> providing for lease of said farm with its buildings, improvements and appurtenances from the first day of April, 1884, to continue for one year from said last named date and thereafter from year to year for the period of five years, with the privilege to the said party of the second part, of taking away, after maturity, any grain or other crop that may be growing on the farm when the lease thereof shall expire and be determined, and

Whereas said lease expired by limitation and ~~maturity~~ <sup>March 31<sup>st</sup></sup> on April 1<sup>st</sup>, 1890 and it being considered to the interests of both parties, that said farm, with its buildings, improvements, and appurtenances, continue under the control and in the

possession of the United States, for one year from April  
1<sup>st</sup> 1890, at an annual rental of Six hundred dollars  
(\$600.),

It is hereby agreed by both parties hereto, that in  
consideration of the payment of the aforesaid sum of  
\$600. per annum to the Executive Committee of the  
said Board of Trustees, party of the first part, the  
Commissioner of Indian Affairs, party of the second  
part, shall have and hold possession of the property

herein described until April 1<sup>st</sup>, 1891 <sup>the rights, privileges &</sup> ~~Subject to all~~ <sup>conditions</sup>  
of the ~~Act~~ <sup>Act</sup> of Dec. 24<sup>th</sup> 1883.
