Replying to yours of 14th inst., marked "Education 14497" with inclosure from Elijah J. Cornelius, I have the honor to state in reference to the two boys Jesse and James, that the former has recently recovered from an attack of rheumatism, brought on by indiscreet exposure, but is now able for duty. James had trouble with his eyes, and is now under treatment for the same.

By a ruling of the Office, where the five year period expires during school term, pupils must remain until end of the term. This would not liberate these boys until a year from now. In cases where health conditions are defective, special consideration is given them, and both of these cases will be so considered when the home going parties are made up, and determined.
