Sir:

In talking School matters with Agent Vandever it appears that he would like a teacher to replace one of our former students whom he intends to transfer to some other position.

Howard Logan, to whom you gave his diploma at our graduating exercises, has a throat trouble that has been held in check for several months by the Doctor, but which requires, my School Physician informs me, complete change of air and location. He suggests New Mexico or Colorado, and I had intended asking you for an appointment in one of the Schools out there for Howard for a year.

After talking with him, Agent Vandever is satisfied that Howard serves his purpose well, and I can recommend him in the highest terms. With Agent Vandever's consent and in his hearing I send you this letter and request that he be appointed to place as teacher at the Navajoe Agency for one year. This will enable Howard to earn the money in part at least which will pay his expenses at College. He has been anxious for some time to find a way to do this.
