Replying to your letter of the 30th of June, Marked Education 18958, 19573, in reference to two boys from the Wind River School, Idaho, and two girls from the Fort Hall School, who desire to come to Carlisle, I have to respectfully inform you that contingent upon their good health and deserving character, I would recommend that they be transferred to Carlisle as soon as we have the funds for that purpose. Your authority for such transfer will be necessary. Having that and the funds I will correspond with the Superintendents, Williams and Roberts, and Agent Fosher, to have them sent in.

I think the idea of congregating a party at Omaha or Chicago not practicable. With the education these young people have, they can just as well travel on to Carlisle alone, as to reach Chicago or Omaha alone.

If these students are really of the better class at these schools, we are on the right road to raise the character of our school work, and to secure good results; and I hope
