Sir:

Replying to your letter of July 8th, '90, marked Education 20362, enclosing letter from Daniel Schanando, Oneida Agency, Wis., I have to respectfully inform you that his son Edwin Schanandore graduated from this School in June, 1889, and immediately, and of his own motion entered into a bargain to work for a farmer in Bucks County, whom he knew, at \$15 a month, with some privileges about school in winter.

In April last I employed this farmer here, and he brought Edwin with him. I require the farmer on his salary to have an assistant. The arrangement is entirely between the farmer and Edwin, and I have not exercised any control over the matter whatever, although I carry him on our rolls in order that I may keep him in mind. It has been entirely within Edwin's power to go home at any time since he graduated last year. I have done nothing whatever to restrain him nor influence him. I think his course a wise one and would gladly see every young man who leaves this School equally independent. Edwin is 23 years of age.
