Sir:

Replying to your letter of February 28th, enclosing letter from Joseph Scanadore, of West DePere, Wis., relative to sending his son home, I have to respectfully inform you that Jemison Scanadore was admitted to Carlisle September 28th, 1888, in a party of students received from Martinsburg, Pa., at the time that contract school was broken up. Like almost all of the large boys that came from that school, his habits were very loose and unreliable. He has been addicted to drink, and last winter a year ago while in the Public schools of Bucks County, was dismissed for ill-treating a colored girl who was a pupil of the school. He is unreliable in every way. In our efforts to get him into a proper course of conduct we have had to discipline him, being twice tried by court martial. On the night of February 25th he ran away with one of the boys who came at the same time he did, and who was quite like him in character, and they are both probably at home at the present time. Unless his


