

The Honorable,

The Commr. of Indian Affairs, Washington, D. C.

Sir:

Having previously had your approval, and also the approval of the Hon. Secretary of the Interior, I now formally and respectfully request authority to erect a blacksmith and wagon shop, 41 x 70; 13 feet to the square, stone foundation, brick walls, tin roof, conforming to the other shops, using in the construction such stone and other material in the old. shop as can be utilized. The plans and estimates made by my principal mechanic call for an outlay of a little more than \$2.000, but, using our own labor, we can construct the building for \$1.600, and I request authority to use that sum in material and labor. Inasmuch as it is an emergency and we should have the building at the beginning of the school vearSeptember 1st, and as we are not able to commence it until after July 1st. I urge that I be authorized to make the various expenditures in connection therewith in open market.





SPECIFICATIONS

for the erection of a building, 70 x 41 feet to be used as a Blacksmith and Wagon shop at the Indian Industrial School, Carlisle, Pa.

The building shall be of dimensions above given and conform in construction and finish to the adjoining building now used as carpenters and shoe shop, &c., the walls being 13 feet to the square.

The foundations shall be laid with good stone and mortar using, as far as possible, the material from the old building. Such additional stone as may be required to be quarried at any designated point on the school grounds and pointed on the outside with cement mortat.

The brick walls shall be 13" in thickness, only hard brick to be used on the cutside and bricks to be laid to a line and struck on the inside, the same as outside of wall, - the partition wall to be 9" thick and carried to comb of roof. Bricks to be well soaked before laid in wall.

A stone foundation shall be laid for each forge designated and built solid to the level of foundation walls; all foundations to be on bed rock of solid clay not less than 2 feet below the surface.

FORGES, - There shall be five forges provided f for, built of brick in the usual manner with brick flues carried one foot above the comb of the roof. There will be four doors, one of 4 feet and 3 of 8 feet in width to be made of good 1" flooring battened and hung on rollers. Frames to be oak mittin 3 in. thick with oak lintel 5 1/2" square.

Windows are marked on the plan, sash 1 1/2" for 11 x 17 glass, 12 lights, frames to suit of 2" pine plank with 4" sill and 5 1/2" in lintel. Inside sill to 1 1/2" plank, plowed into frame, with 4" apron, fitted with Hammond springs, No. 3.


The roof shall be trussed in the same manner as other shops, trusses 14 ft. centre to centre, purlines 4" x 5" and 2" x 6" Rafters covered with 1" hemlock or pipe sheathing and good quality Charcoal time. The cornice to a jonform to adjoining building.


The roof shall be covered with two coats of paint of venetian red and ochre in alternate stripes same as other building.


There shall be three ventilators made to correspond with those on other shops, with sash for 8 x 10 glass.

All wood much work usually painted shall be covered with three coats of good Muchana Wetherell lead paint of colors desired.

The woodworkers shop shall be ceiled with 1" hemlock ceiling, and the opening in ceiling to be ceiled to ventilator.
