Sir

I have the honor to state that I am the uncle (or father in Dakota and guardian of Henry Keoke who is now attending school under Capt Pratt at Carlisle, Penn., and that I am very anxious that said Henry Keoke should be returned to me here as soon as possible. Henry was sent to the school at Carlisle more 6 years ago, and although he was to have returned him at the expiration of 5 years he has not done so. Although Henry himself is very anxious to return. I want Henry here and want to send him to some other school, and as he has passed the allotted 5 years at Carlisle and as I am, as

Henry him self is very anxious  
that he should be returned. I  
Appeal to you to see that Capt  
Pratt returns him immediately. Ac-  
cording to promise Henry should  
have been returned over a year ago.

I intend to send him money  
to enable him to return, and I  
desire hereby to advise the De-  
partment of it as I do not  
want you to think Henry would  
run away &
