in June you asked myself and Miss Deabrook  
to write up something on the care of the sick

in schools, boarding halls &c where the ad-  
vantages of regular hospital nurse can  
not be afforded.

Their symptoms. going into differential diagnosis, or simply treat of symptomatology in general. with methods of meeting emergencies in care. nursing &c. leaving all finer distinctions to be determined by the Physician at the Agency upon his arrival to see the patient. also whether you expect something so arranged that it may be published in pamphlet form or simply included in your Annual Report. And how early must we report the work to you.

also any other suggestions you may wish to make on the subject.
