but she doesn't stay at
Carlisle all this period of
6 years still to day she is
away from Carlisle, and
she wants to returned to
Carlisle very much this fall
and she had written to Capt
Pratt and asked him if he

come
allow her to back to Carlisle
but he made no answer.
So I want to ask you, if it is
right the way Capt. treats his
children that he sends them
away from school without
their consents. I have charge

of that girl ever since she was
a little girl, she ~~has~~ no father
and mother, but I don't think
if there is any man have
more rights to claim of that
girl more than I do.

I want that girl to return
to Carlisle not later than
a first or second week of
October, that the place for her
I want her to go to school and
learn something.

I should like to hear from you in
regard of this matter.
