Sir:

In reply to endorsement on application of George Valliere for the return of Isaac Davis, I have to respectfully inform you that Isaac came to this school on November 2, 1888 for a period of five years. The claim for his return at this time is therefore not valid. We have taken no students for less than five years since 1883, unless they reached graduation before that. The reason offered is one that can be brought up constantly and is being brought up constantly, and if we are to succeed in giving any kind of an education to these Indian youth, it is a reason we must not admit. George Valliere, the writer, graduated from us two years ago. The letter is herewith returned.
