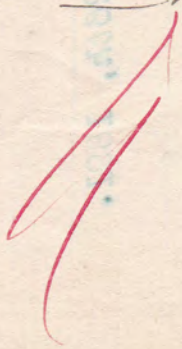

The former firms use such bottles as are usually furnished to the trade use good corks made sufficiently impervious by pasting label over cork. While the latter uses a miserable cheap bottle and worse cork and then plasters this over with a poor quality of ~~sealing~~ wax not only giving the appearance of cheapness, but making a very unsatisfactory bottle to open and use on account of the wax
