George's letter hardly agrees with the <sup>article</sup> ~~letter~~ of Mr. Harries in the Washington Evening Star of Oct. 10th. He probably knows a good deal better than Mr. Harries what the conditions are of our returned students. Inasmuch as Mr. Harries and his committee used George as their clerk for most of their conferences with the Indians, as they used other Carlisle students to interpret and otherwise help them, the letter of Mr. Harries seems to develop a very perfidious trait in his character.
