To the Honorable,

The Commr. of Indian Affairs,

Washington, D.C.

Sir:

Replying to your letter of 11<sup>th</sup> inst. Marked  
Education, 39822-43145-1891, returning  
Report of Irregular Service for October, I  
have respectfully to say, that under authority  
#27509, (not 25709 as letter gives it,) \$192<sup>75</sup> were  
expended on N. No. 111, 1<sup>st</sup> q. 1892, in addition  
to the amounts on Pay Rolls for Augt. Sept. & Oct.  
making \$675.<sup>53</sup> as before given.

In reference to first exception to Report, that  
"names of regular employes have been submitted  
as irregular". This is a mistake. The Farmer,  
Asst. Disciplinarian and Dairyman were approved

Such reasons as there might be given in the report for any, but  
in the column headed "Necessity for" Committee.

as regular Nov. 6, 1891. - See Office letter of  
Nov. 6. 91, Marked "Education 36946." The  
Pay Rolls for October were signed the 31<sup>st</sup> of  
that month. I could not, therefore, pay these  
employees in any other way than as regular.

As to second exception: - employing  
irregular labor to perform work that should be  
done by regular employees. The non-arrival  
of the Annual Supplies greatly delayed our  
work, and when these were received, it became  
necessary to employ additional Sewing Machines  
to make the clothing needed for the Pupils; the  
regular force not being able to make what was  
required. The blacksmith service was special  
and could not be done at the time by the regular  
employee.

Exceptions 3<sup>rd</sup> + 4<sup>th</sup>: - Failure to identify each  
item by its authority, and having "united items."

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By Office letter dated Nov. 22, 1889, Marked  
"Education 32899 - 1889 - Auth. 204200"

I am directed to "make reports for irregular  
"Service which has not been authorized,"  
"separate from reports for service for which"  
"you have received authority. In each"  
"Case please state the Character of the Service,"  
"and in the latter case give the number of the"  
"Authority." The October Report, and previous  
ones, followed these directions; but complying  
with directions of your letter, I forward here-  
-with page 5, made up as required.

Authority # 27223 allows \$3500.- for erection  
of Office; not to exceed \$3000.- for materials.  
The estimate calls for \$50.- for excavation, 156.<sup>40</sup>-  
for Stone work, and \$500.- for Carpenter work  
- total \$706.<sup>40</sup>-; of which I have expended  
for Carpenter work, July # 156.88, Aug. 54.<sup>25</sup>- not

\$99.<sup>68</sup> - as stated in your letter - Sept. <sup>\$</sup>111.<sup>62</sup> ✓  
 Oct. <sup>\$</sup>84. - amounting to \$406.<sup>75</sup>; for Mason  
 work July <sup>\$</sup>71.<sup>12</sup>, Oct. <sup>\$</sup>33.<sup>00</sup>, amounting to  
 \$104.<sup>12</sup>
