Dear Sir:

We have had now three crops of measles, and at no time have we had more than 14 down at one time. There is reasonable hope that it will leave us and we may go ahead with our commencement exercises on the 24th, and accordingly we send out invitations to-day. I have arranged so that I can control a train from Washington to Carlisle and return. It would be far better if those who come would leave Washington at 3.30 on the afternoon of the 23rd and come through that evening and give us the whole day. I hope that may be accomplished, but if not I will have a train leave Washington between 7.30 and 8 o'clock the morning of the 24th which will reach here before 12 o'clock, and returning leave here at 5 o'clock and be in Washington on or before 9 o'clock. I have written both Senator Dawes and Col. Peel particulars.

As I verbally informed you, I have asked Dr. Rhoads, President of Bryn Mawr College to deliver the diplomas, and I have fixed the afternoon exercises for two hours and a half, and trust we may have some speeches from members of Congress,
