Sir:

Referring to my letter to you dated January 4th, in relation to having our incorrigible students transferred to the State Reformatory at Huntingdon, I have to respectfully advise you that Abner St. Cyr, a Winnebago, who had stolen several times before and had been tried by our school court and punished, broke open the satchel of another student and stole therefrom a new suit of clothes costing \$15. I consulted with Judge Sadler and brought St. Cyr before the court. He was tried and convicted and sentenced to the State Reformatory at Huntingdon and has been sent there. Judge Sadler thinks it unnecessary that there should be any provision on the part of the Government to pay to the Reformatory anything in such cases, as under the law the State has to take care of all such cases within its limits. I am glad that this method of disposing of any hardened youth who may be sent here has opened for us and am sure it will only lead to the very best of results.
