Commissioner of Indian Affairs:

Dear Sir:

This communication is at the request and in behalf of Mr Charles Hill, an Oneida, who lives near the Mission House. He is the father of Abram Hill, aged nineteen years, who has been for seven years a pupil at Carlisle.

It is his request that his son be allowed to return to him.

The reason for the request is that for two years past ^{his father,} he has been growing blind, and cannot see to distinguish one person from another at a distance of eight feet.

This incapacitates him largely for the performance of labor, and he asks you to send an order for his son's release, that he may have his help in doing the work on his farm.

I have known the man for a year and can assure you that he needs his son's help.
