Sir:

Referring to your letter of April 12th, in reference to fires at schools, etc., I have to respectfully advise you that all the precautions you urge have been followed here during the whole history of the school. As a result we have never had nor have we been in any serious danger from fire. We have, as you know a good hand-engine which has more force than either of the steam fire engines of the town of Carlisle. Our boys are drilled to handle it, and we are always among the first at fires in the town. We have repeatedly been received ~~with~~ thanks from the community for our promptness and services. Fire plugs throughout our grounds make water convenient to every building, and we have, in addition, three large cisterns which we contrive to keep full of water.

There is, therefore, no estimates or suggestions that I could make in the way of improving our facilities for overcoming fire.

I may add that the three steam fire engines of the


