I have been employed at this School as Clerk and Stenographer to Capt Pratt for nearly two years. For some time I have been a sufferer from Nasal Catarrh which does not improve, owing, I believe, to the damp and unsteady nature of the climate here, and it becomes necessary for me to seek a location which will be drier and more favorable.
