Sir:

I am booked for a paper before the National Conference of Charities and Correction, at Denver, Col., on 28th inst. It has been my desire to make a break on the Utes, and I had thought of making this the occasion. Inasmuch as my contribution to the Convention is entirely gratuitous and must necessarily be attended with some expense, under any circumstances, I have thought I would be warranted in covering my expenses under my authority to bring in children, in making this attempt on the Utes. Mr. Philip C. Garrett, of the Board of Commissioners, was here a few days ago and very urgently desired me to accompany him on a visit he would make to the Grand Junction School and some other points. I do not feel that I could spare the time to go elsewhere, but as Grand Junction is not far from the Southern Utes I would be very willing to go there.


