Court d. O'Neil's June 21, 1892

The Honorable Commissioner of Indian Affairs  
Sir, I have the honor to inform you that I arrived here yesterday Evening. Quite a number are at Carlisle from here; and I find the prospect discouraging because all appear to be contented, and doing well. They write home letters calculated to induce others to go. I would like to spend a longer time here and at Flambeau than I feel that I can spend! It is now nearly June 30<sup>th</sup> and I have been over but a small portion of my district, canvassing; and it is work that cannot be hurried. It takes time! I do not, however, intend to ask for any vacation and hope to be able during all of July and August to accomplish the work to your satisfaction.

I shall be in Ashland Wisconsin next Monday, Tuesday 27<sup>th</sup> or 28<sup>th</sup>. when a Telegram will reach me. I have the honor to remain
