To the Honorable,

The Commr. of Indian Affairs,

Washington, D. C.

Sir:--

Replying to your letter of June 28th, marked Education, 22,943, with enclosed explanation and list of Supervisor Ansley, covering children of the Flambeau La Pointe Agency, who wish to be transferred to Carlisle, I have respectfully to advise you that I have no objection to receiving pupils who have never been in school, and this will probably be necessary in order to keep up our numbers until the new plan of grades and promotions gets into swing. I am willing therefore, if you authorize, to arrange not only for those named on this list, but such others as Mr. Ansley may be able to secure, always contingent on the youth being of proper age and character, and in good health. I note specially what Supervisor Ansley says in reference to health examination, and prefer to send my school physician after the children, that he may protect us so far as he can from unhealthy, under-aged, and bad characters.


In reference to the party from Cour-de-Oreillas, I think they had better be sent to some other school. We have never had as bad children as have come to us from that particular

locality. We have had our share, and in our large school, with its better opportunities, ought not to be cumbered with that class. In this connection I feel called upon to say, that making up lists of children, and forwarding the children, are two separate transactions, and I have from experience, very little expectation of materially realizing pupils from these lists.
