Sir:--


In connection with your letter of July 27th, marked Education, 26,434, I have respectfully to advise you that I am in receipt of a letter from David S. Keck, U. S. Supervisor, dated Kutztown, Pa., July 26th, which informs me that he has orders from the Commissioner of Indian Affairs to bring 100 Indian children to this school. He asks whether he will be permitted to send children here who have never heretofore attended any school. It seems strange that the matter of getting children should be referred to me, and then the Supervisor receive instructions to bring in about as many children as I have intended to get in all. Also, that he should not be fully posted as to the quality of the children he is to bring here. Your letter informs me that we are not allowed to take any who have not attended school for a period of three years. As I have already laid plans for the gathering of about as many as we shall be able to carry next year, it seems to me that the order to Mr. Keck had better be withdrawn, except as to a limited number

of specially worthy students. Any of this class, I would not bar out even though our numbers were increased above what we contemplate.
