Dear Sir -

I am going
to write you a letter this
morning. In connection about
my home, I went, and asked
Capt. to let me go home for
three weeks and see about
my property but he refused
me I have been here 7 years
last Sept 30, 1892. My things
or property I should say
are not well cared for
and I'd like to go home
and sell my home and
my land and then come
right back here again

and stay in the East
for good & learn my own
living. Please let me
hear from you soon.

P.S. The reason I am
not willing to stay at
home is because my
folks are dead & the man
takes care of my property
is not well civilized.
My father gave me the
home I have now and
I am going to be among
the civilized & among the
Eastern people rest of
my life.
