The Commissioner of Indian Affairs,
Washington, D.C.

Sir:

Referring to your letter of Oct. 18th marked "Education 37206 - 92" relative to application of Louisa Smith to go home to look after her property etc- I have the honor to report that on questioning Louisa Smith I find that her father possessed land in his own right "or that is her understanding" and dying it became hers and her brother's-John Smith- now a resident of Green Bay Agency. Also that for the last seven years the land has been in the occupation of her uncle, Moses Peters, also an Indian of the Green Bay Agency.

The said Peters she understands has not made good use or taken good care of the property and now threatens to sell it and claim the proceeds. She therefore desires that her interests be protected which it seems to me can better be done by the Agent in charge at Green Bay than herself.

Her brother is of age but seems to take no interest in the affair. I return enclosure herewith.
