Sir:

Replying to yours of the 8th marked "Edⁿ"
39708. inclosing letter from L. N. Bennette
Richwood Minn. in reference to his son, now
at this school, I have to respectfully report
that a notice was placed in the post office
at White Earth that I would be there at a
given date after students for this school,
and the qualities necessary & eligibles stated.

On my arrival I found Bennettes name with
about 30 others. It seemed generally known
who had signified intention to join the party.

I was there nearly a week. Charles Bonnette joined the party at Detroit on the way east. This was arranged so because he lived near Detroit. He tells me now that three weeks before starting he told his father he intended to come with the party and that his father objected. When he left his father was away but his mother knew of his leaving but also objected.

Under the circumstances I think if his fare home is paid it would be as well to let him return.
