The Commissioner of Indian Affairs.

Washington, D.C.

Sir:-

Referring to your letter of Jan. 11th marked "Education, 45363" in which you say you prefer not to approve changes submitted by me on Dec. 21st until you have the written resignations of former school employes I have respectfully to advise you that my sense of propriety will not permit me to run after a disgruntled fireman who quits our service on a few hours notice at mid-night because he finds a place where he can get a little better pay, nor after a store-keeper who demands promotion to a higher salary under penalty of quitting our service on short notice unless his ambitions are met, and I have further to say that I have other and more important things to bother my brain and to occupy my attention. You will therefore please excuse me from furnishing any further documents or statements in regard to these employes.

The important signature of Mr. Foster on the back of his document in reference to Mr. Williamson has finally been obtained and the same is herewith.
