Sir.

While at Warm Springs Agency recently, Agt-Lucky, Supt Mann of the Boarding School & the Presbyterian Missionary Rev. Alter spoke to me of the desire of a young Indian Wm. He, who was very anxious to go to Carlisle for further instruction in his studies, & at his chosen trade of carpentry. He is about 19 yrs of age, & they all spoke of him, as intelligent, & willing, & of good character & reputation. He has been at the Chemung School near Salina for several years, but as the facilities there are not so good as at Carlisle, is very anxious to be permitted to attend the latter institution. As I understand it is the policy of the Indian Office to give special opportunities to the more intelligent Indian youth who manifest a special desire for more advanced instruction. I respectfully recommend this case to the favorable consideration of the Dept. & request that this paper be filed as an appendix to the report recently
