Sir:

Replying to yours of June 3rd marked "Education, 19551" enclosing letter from Chas. R.H. Smith, a pupil in this school who writes you that he desires to go home I respectfully enclose to you letters from my school physician and my disciplinarian giving the facts in his case. Charles' name was on the home-going list and he took it off by his own act in going to the country. In view of the contents of his letter and the report of my school physician together with the report of the patron with whom Charles is now I think it best he go home and have accordingly restored his name to the home-going list, the party to leave here early in July.

Chas. R. H. Smith is not at the School, but is living with Jos. P. Canby, of Langhorne, Bucks Co., Pa. He was placed there Apr. 1st, '93 at Charles' solicitation with the understanding that he was not to go home this summer.

During the early Spring his health was not the best and the doctor advised that he wait until later to go to the Country, but Charlie was so anxious that the doctor reversed his decision.

For your information I enclose copies of his monthly reports for Apr. and May, by which you will see that he is improving in health.

Sir.

During the foot ball season last year. Chas. Red Hawk Smith received a stroke or fall in a rush, and it resulted in a Gluteal abscess, which kept him in Hospital for several weeks. In time this, after a free incision, and persistent treatment, healed and his general health, which had run down, improved. And when the spring approached he was persistent in his begging to be allowed to go out on farm for the summer. I at last yielded with the advice that he wait until the 2^d party went, so as to insure better weather. But go he must and he went with the first party. April 1st. In two or three weeks he wrote me that he had taken cold and was afraid he was not going to stand it, but promised to write

again if not better. I answered his letter giving him direction for the care of himself and urging him to keep me informed as to his health. I have heard nothing since except such reports as come from his employer.

The boys health is not at all satisfactory and I should have been more inclined to recommend his going home than to advise his trying the farm but for his persistence in the course chosen.
