Your speech in the dining room yester-
 day morning seemed to me to cover the
 ground. The fact that it takes years of
 persistent schooling to enable the Anglo
 Paxon boy to look out for Number one
 in the best of surroundings needs to be
 made as much of as the pusillanimous vaporing
 of some of the idiots who induce or compel our
 returned students to dance and then tell the
 County that Indian Education is a failure.

Your cool statements on this line with
 instructions to Agents and School Supts.
 to impress them upon the Indians old
 and young, will tell on the Indians and
 on the County.

Your and Mrs. Morgans visit will ever
 remain one of the most significant events in
