
To the Honorable,

The Commr. of Indian Affairs,
Washington, D. C.

Sir:--

Referring to your verbal approval, on Wednesday, of my going after, or sending for children to fill up this school under the orders already furnished me, I have respectfully to invite your attention to your circular of April 21st, which is of such a nature as, in my judgment, to require some special authority which I may show to the ^{several} Agents where I may go or send for children, or to be otherwise generally explained to the Agents, in accordance with our conversation, else we shall be at a great disadvantage in securing pupils at all. I would respectfully invite your attention to the law which provides for coercion, both in the Indian Appropriation Bill of the current year '93, and for the ensuing year '94.
