Washington D.C.

Sir:

Replying to your letter of July 15th marked "Education 25163" inclosing letter from Fred Penn, pupil at this school from the Osage Agency, which letter is here returned, I have to respectfully advise you that, Fred came to Carlisle in October 1891 and had been in the Osage Agency School four years prior to that. He is now nineteen years old. His Indian name is Huh-hah-shaw. Both Father

and mother died when he was quite small. Father's name was Chief Eagle. He has no brothers or sisters living. Was raised by an aunt, wife of Wah-hah-toe.

Just before he left the Agency, he thinks in Sept. 1891 Agent Miles sent for him to come to his office where he signed the rolls for annuity and the Agent paid him \$47.⁷⁵/₁₀₀, and this is the only money he ever received from the Govt.

I think Fred quite capable of carrying out his expressed intentions.
