I have the honor to refer again to the matter of the transfer of pupils from this School to Carlisle, which I made the subject of a communication dated June 19th last. Capt. Pratt writes me that he has authority to take children from any school with the consent of the Superintendent, but since his writing I have received your circular letter to Agents and Superintendents July 27, 1893), announcing that all Indian pupils (Education. must be returned to the school in which they were enrolled the previous year, and that no deviation from the rule should be made except under authority from your Office. Therefore, I respectfully renew the request for authority to trans-fer the two boys mentioned in my letter of the 19th of June; and further I have to request authority to transfer another boy who desires to go to This one is a Pueblo Indian who has been in school three years or more in different schools, and is a good student. The names of the three are Edwadr Vicente, Sidney Smith and Zac. Chacon.
