Sir:

Replying to your letter of Nov. 15, marked "education 42309" asking if T. L. Deavor, and Philip L. Deavor, (probably Drum) desire appointments as teachers at any other school, I have to respectfully advise you that Mr. Drum is already assistant teacher under your appointment at this school, and that I will send in his name for appointment as teacher in place of H. M. Hudelson, who resigns on account of ill health. Mr. Deavor was also appointed assistant teacher here, but before reporting was taken dangerously ill with a brain trouble and is only just now able to be up. He is not allowed to write or receive letters. I sent my Mr. Drum to his home at Laidig, Fulton Co., Pa. to find out about him two weeks ago as I had continued his name on our lists, hoping he would be able for duty. His Doctors report that he will not be allowed to go into a school room this year. I ^{shall} therefore, ask to have his name cancelled as assistant teacher at Carlisle.
