Sir,

While visiting Carlisle school, I asked Capt Pratt for the admission of two little girls twelve years of age residing on our reservation. he said "New York children were shut out of that school," which I think is just the right school for Indians but there is no prospect of the State doing anything of that sort for her Indians the little girls are all right now but will not be in a little while if not removed from their surroundings. Capt. Pratt says he will take them if you say so just now their ruin or their rescue rests on you. Oh! save them.
