

To the Honorable


The Commissioner of Indian Affairs,
Washington, D. C.

Sir:-

I respectfully forward herewith joint letter from Captain Brown, ex-acting Agent, and Lt. Nichols, present Acting Indian Agent of the Kiowas and Comanches, urging me to use my influence in behalf of Quannah and Lone Wolf, Chiefs of the Kiowa and Comanche Indians, and get permission for them to visit Washington in regard to the recent treaty made with them, which is now pending before Congress. I have known these Indians for 27 years, and know much of their causes of complaint. I sympathize with their wishes in the matter. They will pay their own expenses to Washington.

They also desire that the official interpreter at their Agency, Mr. Woodward, be permitted to come East at once to assist in making their cause known. They will also pay his expenses. I recommend that their wishes in this matter be granted.
