I have a letter from Capt. Pratt, to Dr. Walker who is on duty at the Okanogan school, saying he is authorized to make arrangements for transportation etc., but I have thought best to obtain your approval before taking any other action.

There is one young girl here whose parents have consented to her going, that I am particularly interested in having sent there.
