She is not able to work, but very little. so I would be very glad to see my girl home now. There is three of my girls there in the Carlisle school. so I would like Ophelia King to come home if you please. — I will tell you why I ask you this because as I know of you. You are the one that got the most power of that school than Capt. Pratt. I have wrote to Capt Pratt once but he never answer it.

I have stoped writing to Capt Pratt first when I want to ask him to send my child home because he always just write to the commissioner first and maybe he just object to the quistion. and of course maybe you may belive him.

So I would like if you please to send my child home. you know hard how hard

it is to have no body to work in house.
it is just that way to me now days for
my wife is sick and not able to work.
she may work little but not much.
so I would like if you please to send
Ophelia King home.
