Sir: -

There are two boys upon this reservation, (Antwine Miller and Ambrose Mark) who desire to go to a Training School. They are eighteen years of age. Supt. Clendening, saw Captain Pratt at Chemowa, this summer, and it seems they had some conversation about these boys, and Captain Pratt, agrees to pay their way to Carlisle, Pa., and Supt. Clendening, recommends that they be sent there. I am not familiar with the way you arrange these matters, but it strikes me that a Training School nearer than Carlisle, would answer every purpose. I have tried to induce the boys to make application for Chemowa, but the Indians upon this reservation, have a very great prejudice against that school, because many of the children from here have died there, and they will not agree to go.

If it is your desire that Supt. Clendening's recommendation be carried out, and that the boys be sent to Carlisle, please inform me what is necessary for me to do to get them there.
