
Hon. Commissioner of Indian Affairs,



Dear Sir:-

On August 27th I wrote you in regard to the expenses incurred by Albert Mulligan in having his eye treated and asking that his parents remit \$45.70 covering the same. Since then I have had no word from you. I have no funds to meet this expense and as the boy's parents are well able to stand the expense and agreed to and as Albert has been helped so greatly by the treatment his family should not delay meeting this bill. Albert was careless and broke his eye which necessitated his return to the hospital for further treatment and a new eye which has added to the original bill. I enclose an itemized account of his indebtedness. Will you not kindly see that Mrs. Boyd sends at least the \$50.00. she agreed through you to pay towards this, and greatly oblige,
