Dear Doctor:-

Mr. Campbell of Sisseton Agency, South Dakota, has a party of children, from 8 to 12, he thinks quite suitable for Carlisle and the parents of whom are willing they should come. He wishes very much to bring them in himself in order that he may attend to some business matters here and also bring his two boys back here and place them in the town schools. He asks me if I can arrange for him to come. His absence from the school would not be more than six or seven days. I submit the matter to you thinking it better that you speak to the Commissioner about it. Indeed it seems to me something that Mr. Campbell should arrange himself, although I would be glad to have the children and if consent is given he says he will be here at once with them. I have already arranged for the transportation. Please wire me on receipt of this if Mr. Campbell will be allowed to come in.
