
Sir :-

Replying to your letter of the 20th, marked "Education 21101", covering application to the Honorable Secretary of the Interior of Jacob Cobmoosa, complaining of the illegal detention here of his personal effects, I have respectfully to advise you that Jacob's effects consist of one cheap violin, one cheap trunk, one pbush cap, three collars and four ties, etc. and property issued by the Government ; that Jacob was in debt to the School \$1.93, and it is questionable whether his effects, if put up at auction, would bring this amount.

I have ordered their sale. Should there be any excess, I will turn the sum into our library or emergency fund, which is the course we take with the effects of all runaways.

Jacob left the school while under punishment for a serious offence, and his character was such that I was rather glad he had taken it upon himself to leave. Jacob's letter to the Interior Department, I herewith return.
