Sir :

Replying to your letter of June 19th, not numbered, about Lou D. Remington and a soldier James M. Delaney, I have to say that the authorized pay list of employes for the ensuing year does not conform to my recommendation, as you told me it would. The one teacher I dropped at \$540. is retained, and the additional teacher at \$660. I asked for is not granted. There will therefore be no place for either of the men you name, for I must advance Miss Silcott's salary if she remains. The salary available for the new teacher will therefore be only \$540.

Let this matter rest a short time until I see Miss Nellie V. Robertson, a graduate of this school who is just ending her third year at the West Chester Normal, and who wishes to work the ensuing year. I may think well to ask her appointment at one of the lowest salaries, and this would fill our complement of teachers.
