Sir:

Some time ago I corresponded with Agent Dougherty of Hooka Valley concerning some children, a boy and three girls, whom he had recommended for transfer to Carlisle. I objected to him on account of the distance and expense and suggested Chemawa. In his answer, however, he showed that there exist specific reasons why they should rather go to Carlisle. The children are so well advanced that for general education Chemawa could offer them few additional advantages. They are bright and ambitious and desire to prepare themselves for teaching, and for their purpose Carlisle or Haskell alone are satisfactory. Inasmuch, however, as Carlisle is their choice, and the transportation to Haskell would weaken the general fund, whereas Carlisle has special funds for this purpose, I should prefer Carlisle for them; I would, therefore, recommend that you issue Agt. Dougherty authority to transfer these four children to Carlisle.
