

Referring to yours of the 10th marked "9302", it seems proper to advise you that a letter from T. W. Potter, Supt. of the Chemawa School, asks me for a suitable person for the position of band leader and industrial teacher, and in answer I have written him of Josiah George and his recent marriage to Elizabeth Wind, our assistant nurse ; also that when Supt.
