Complying with the request in your letter of the 1st inst., marked "Supt. 20556/96", I respectfully submit the following remarks indicative of the character and qualifications of the persons named in your letter, so far as we have knowledge of them from their School record and subsequent history.

John Baptiste. Winnebago, Class '93.

Has ability, but a poor record here, except as a worker; His diploma was earned only by his scholarship, not at all by character; has since been at Hampton, and as I have understood was not satisfactory there.

Levi St. Cyr. Class '91.

Is a young man of good character and medium ability. He is now employed at this School as Assistant Printer and does well here but has not the go for a regular printer's position. Levi is also a Winnebago, and has considerable musical ability; is a member of the School band.

Benjamin Lowry. Winnebago. Class '90.

Is a young man of ordinary ability and fair character; competent as a general worker, Asst. Farmer or Industrial Teacher. He is married and has been employed at the Winnebago School. I know of nothing against him or his wife who is an educated neat young woman of the St. Cyr family.

Lawrence Smith. Winnebago. Class '90.

Has good mental ability, but is deficient in character and energy; he has the ability to make a teacher and has had some experience; would probably do well for a little while.


Dr. Hailman.
