The Commissioner of Indian Affairs,

Washington, D. C.

Sir:-

Inviting attention to my letter of July 6th 1895 covering estimate for fiscal year 1897 and to your estimates as submitted to Congress and the appropriation allowed us for the current year, I have the honor to submit plans for the laundry building which I propose to erect, principally with our own labor. After further investigation I have determined that a one-story building, where all the work is in one room at all times under the observation and direction of the Laundress, is best.

I respectfully request your authority to expend in the open market purchase of material at the lowest obtainable rates the sum of \$2265.00 for brick, lumber, windows, doors, roofing material, glass, paint, putty, drain pipe, hardware, etc., etc., and for such labor as we are unable to perform ourselves, masons, plasterers, cementing floor, and extra carpenter help, the sum of \$1187.00, in all \$3452.00.

Supplemental to my letter of yesterday asking authority for the erection of a Laundry Building, I have to respectfully advise you that this building is needed at once, in order that we may have the use of it as near the opening of school in Sept. as practicable. This can be best and most economically done by using my employees and students, which will give us the valuable opportunity of employment and instruction for students which we would not have if the building were erected by contract. I have to further advise you that through our system of inviting from all dealers proposals (see inclosed form) we secure greater promptness and equally as favorable rates as can be obtained through newspaper advertising.

GROUND PLAN OF LAUNDRY

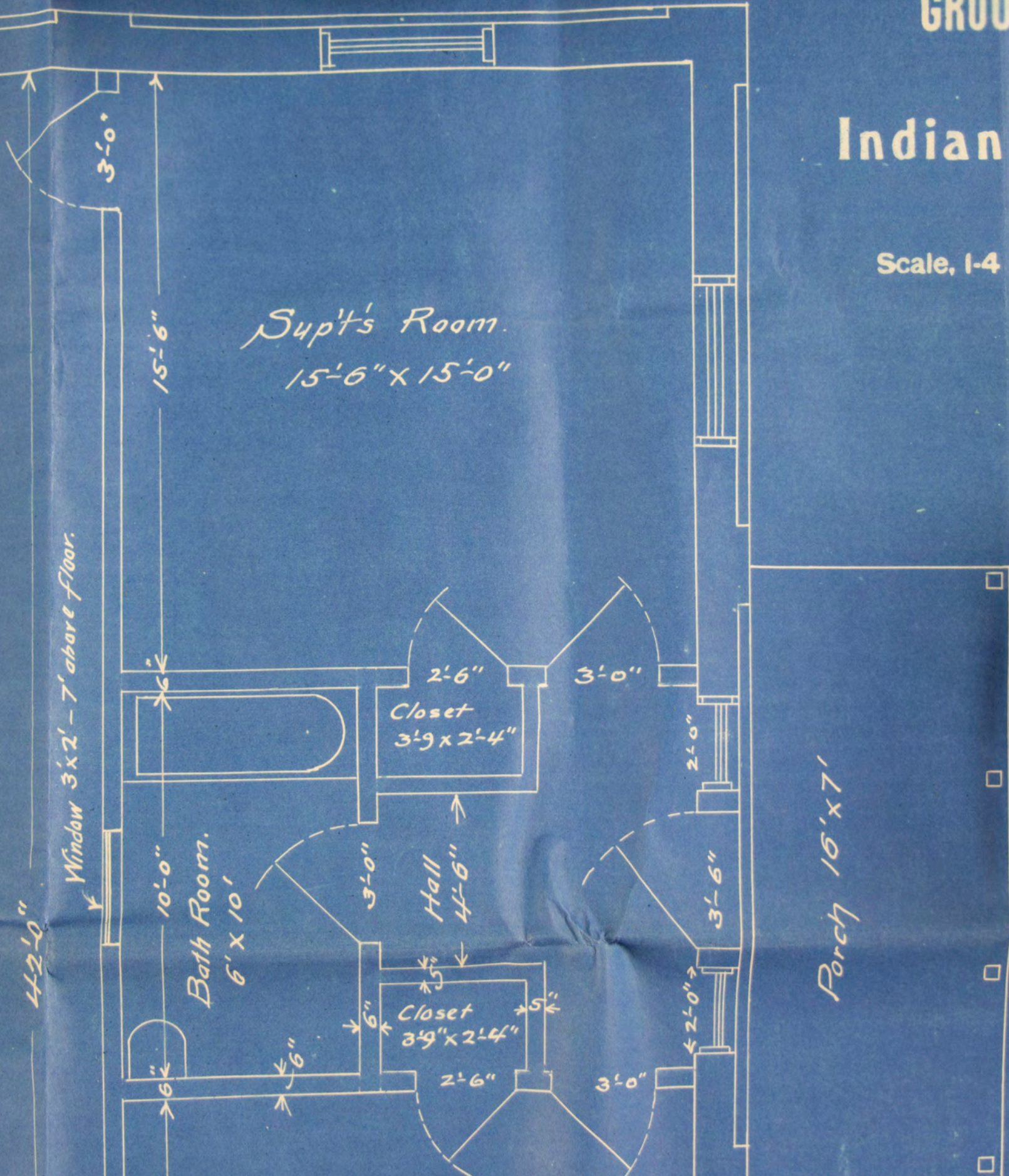

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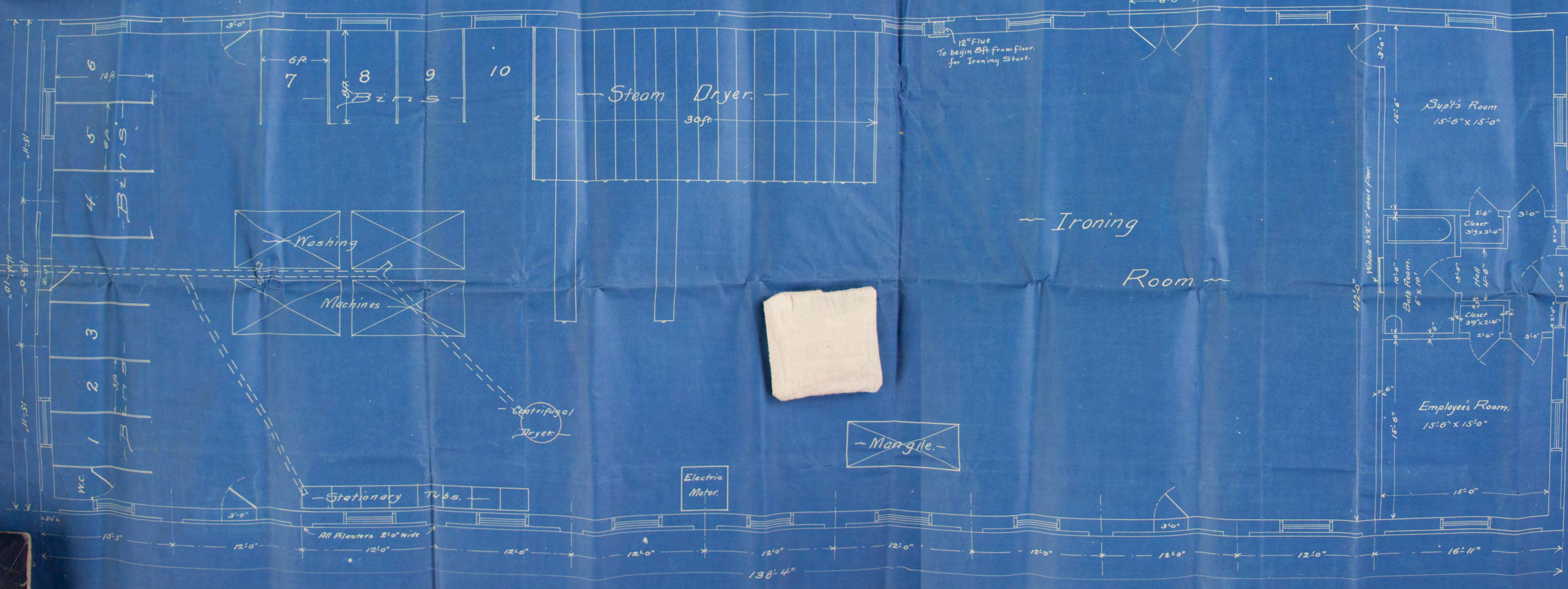
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GROUND PLAN OF LAUNDRY
